

**UNIVERSITY OF KYRENIA
FACULTY OF AERONAUTICS AND SPACE SCIENCES
STUDENT DRESS CODE**

FIRST

SECTION Purpose

Article 1 - The purpose of this directive is to specify the principles of dress code for the students of the Faculty of Aviation and Space Sciences in order to provide them with a sense of belonging, discipline and the ability to follow the rules.

TWO

Article 2 - It covers the issues that the students studying in the Departments of the Faculty of Aviation and Space Sciences must follow in terms of dress and grooming during their education, and the dress and grooming practices of the students in units, institutions and organisations other than their Departments for internship, theoretical, applied education and training activities (provided that the matters specified in the general principles remain constant) are subject to the savings and sanctions of the units in question.

THIRD

SECTION Duration and

Article 3 - The students of the Faculty of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Department of Aeronautical Engineering are subject to the practices in the general principles and are not obliged to wear uniforms. Pilotage Department students are obliged to wear uniforms as stated in the scope. Students of the Aviation Management Department may wear uniforms upon request.

Article 4 - Unless otherwise stated (taking into account seasonal changes), they will wear winter/seasonal uniforms between November-30 April (included) and summer uniforms between 2 May-31 October. The Dean's Office reserves the authority over these periods.

Article 5 - The uniform consists of a hat, epaulet shirt, tie, sweater, jacket, trousers, belt, coat, socks, shoes, badge, signs and insignia. It is a whole and cannot be modified.

a. Summer uniform;

i) Shirt: Short-sleeved, buttoned, white, cotton or blended, white buttoned, cloth shirt with epaulettes and double breast pocket flap. Badge on the upper left breast pocket of the shirt, and a university symbol on the left breast pocket flap. Ribboned epaulette indicating what grade he is in.

ii) Tie Black, plain, fabric tie of medium thickness (tie end to be worn in the centre of the belt buckle).

iii) Tie clip (optional): Plain, unpainted, grey metal, no symbols) will be positioned between the shirt flaps.

iv) Belt: Plain grey metal, unpainted, dark navy blue cloth belt with metal buckle (the belt tongue will be adjusted so that it is two finger lengths outside the belt buckle).

v) Trousers: Dark navy blue, two side pockets, two flap back pockets, front zip fastening, straight or at most double pleated, fabric trousers (normal cuffs, normal cut, cuff length draped over the shoes, one or two fingers above the ground, but the cuff draping shall be in a straight form that will not cause wrinkling, gathering or piling).

vi) Socks Black ankle-covering socks, plain, black without a crest.

vii) Footwear: Black, flat, buckle-less loafers or moccasins (standard heel for female students) or black trainers with no visible crest or symbol.

viii) Hat: A fabric hat with dark navy blue visor and brim, with the university crest, shall be worn. Wearing a hat is compulsory on ceremonies, special occasions and when announced by the Faculty and is optional on other days.

b. Seasonal uniform;

i) Shirt: Long-sleeved, buttoned, white, cotton or blended, white buttoned, cloth shirt with epaulettes and double breast pocket flap. Badge on the upper left breast pocket of the shirt, and a university symbol on the left breast pocket flap. Ribboned epaulette indicating what grade he is in.

(Other clothing as in summer uniform)

c. Winter uniform;

i) Shirt: Long sleeves with epaulettes, buttoned cuffs, double breast pockets with flaps, white cotton shirt with white buttons. Badge on the upper left breast pocket of the shirt, and a university symbol on the left breast pocket flap. Ribboned epaulette indicating what grade he is in.

ii) Tie Black, plain, fabric tie of medium thickness (tie end to be worn in the centre of the belt buckle).

iii) Tie clip (optional): Plain, unpainted, grey metal, no symbols) will be positioned between the shirt flaps. The tie clip shall be worn in such a way that it cannot be seen through the sweater and jacket.

iv) Sweater: Dark navy blue plain sweater with epaulettes, v-neck, normal knit, no crest, no pattern, no embroidery, no pockets.

v) Jacket: Dark navy blue two-button, fabric classic blazer (with yellow flat metal buttons) with flap side pockets (for Professional Pilotage Department students, the cuffs of the jacket are unbuttoned so that it is possible to wear a ribbon for the licence level). A badge shall be worn on the upper left breast pocket of the jacket, and the university insignia (symbol) shall be worn on the left breast pocket. Wearing a jacket is compulsory for ceremonies, special occasions and when announced by the Faculty and is optional on other occasions.

vi) Coat: Dark navy blue, collared, front zip fastening, two pockets on the side and waterproof coat will be used and it is compulsory to wear when announced by the Faculty and it is optional to wear on other days.

vii) Belt: Plain grey metal, unpainted, dark navy blue cloth belt with metal buckle (the belt tongue will be adjusted so that it is two finger lengths outside the belt buckle).

viii) Trousers: Dark navy blue, two side pockets, two flap back pockets, front zip fastening, straight or at most double pleated, fabric trousers (normal cuff, normal cut, cuff length draped over the shoe, one or two fingers above the ground, but the cuff draping shall be in a straight form that will not cause wrinkling, gathering, piling).

ix) Socks Black ankle-covering, plain, armless black socks.

x) Footwear: Black, flat, unbuckled, moccasins or skarpins (standard heel for female students) or black unbuckled boots without a buckle so that the coat of arms symbol is not visible.

xi) Hat: A fabric hat with dark navy blue visor and brim, with the university crest, shall be worn. Wearing a hat is compulsory on ceremonies, special occasions and when announced by the Faculty and is optional on other days.

d. Clothes to be worn over the uniform;

If there is a need to wear additional clothing over the uniform due to weather conditions outside the university or during transport, until entering the university boundaries, there is no harm in wearing additional clothing (raincoat, coat, coat, etc.) so as not to disrupt the integrity of the uniform.

SECTION FOUR

General Principles

Article 6 - Students are obliged to use the clothes they wear in accordance with the provisions of the Dress Code with the cleanliness and care befitting the dignity of a university student. A complement to the uniform is the general dress and behaviour of the students. Male students of the Faculty of Aviation and Space Sciences are responsible for shaving their beards on a daily basis (no beards, moustaches, long sideburns, etc.). If the hair of female students is long, it must be tied up, and the hair of male students must be short and unpainted. The most important principle in dress and attire is to avoid any clothing, attire, clothing, clothing, accessories, décolleté and make-up that will prevent students from focusing on their lessons, distract or draw attention to themselves. It is not appropriate for students to enter the lessons in sea clothes, sports clothes (except sports clothes), night clothes, home clothes (slippers, pajamas, etc.). Students should not wear tattoos, jewellery, clothes, etc. that contain writings, symbols, signs and symbols that are inappropriate for social values, and should prefer "casual" or "semi-formal" (jacket, tie) clothing within the university boundaries.

a. Hygiene (all activities and measures taken for a healthy life)

Students should have neat and well-groomed hair, clean and short nails. Students should pay attention to their dental health. Students' personal hygiene should be complete, taking into account that they live in a semi-tropical climate, measures should be taken to prevent the formation of unpleasant odours. It is not appropriate to take off shoes in closed areas. Students should avoid excessive use of fragrances (perfume, deodorant, etc.) that will prevent them from focusing on their lessons, distract or draw attention to themselves.

b. Accessories

Students should remove their sunglasses, hats, caps, berets, etc. as accessories during the lesson in closed areas, should not wear their headphones during the lesson and should not use their mobile phones under any circumstances (mobile phones should be kept in a closed or silent place, in a bag or pocket if possible, and should not be in visible places).

Apart from the Regulation, requests for the use and application of clothing and dress code will be put into effect after a written application is made to the Faculty Secretariat and evaluated and decided by the relevant units of the Faculty.

SECTION SIX

Enforcement and Execution

Article 9 - The provisions of the Student Discipline Regulation are applied to those who do not comply with the matters specified in the dress code.

Article 10 - This Directive enters into force as of 1 October 2021 upon its adoption by the Faculty Board. Issues not included in the Directive are decided by the Faculty Administrative Board.

Article 11 - This Directive is executed by the Dean's Office of the Faculty of Aviation and Space Sciences.
